

SHC COVID TESTING REQUIREMENTS

For the Month of January, 2022

Faculty/Staff and Students who have tested Positive for COVID-19

Please follow the testing protocols below after testing positive for COVID-19. In counting days, “Day 0” is the day you first experience symptoms **or** the day you tested positive, whichever came first. The next day would be “Day 1,” then “Day 2,” and so on. Currently, these protocols are the same regardless of your vaccination status.

Day 0 - Day 5 No testing is required. Isolation required.

Day 5 - Day 10 Rapid antigen testing is allowed once a day. If negative, you may return to campus the next day (the day after you test negative) as long as you have no fever (for 24 hours and without using medication) and your symptoms are improving or resolved. If positive, continue to isolate.

You must submit a negative result to attendance@shcp.edu (students) or HRConfidential@shcp.edu (faculty/staff) before returning to campus. This reporting is mandatory for those leaving isolation before 10 days.

Day 11 - 20 No testing is required and you may return to school. After 10 days of isolation, you do not need a negative test result to return. You may return as long as you do not have a fever (for 24 hours and without using medication) and your symptoms are improving or resolved.

Day 20 - 90 After 20 days from a positive COVID test, rapid antigen tests are to be taken at least once a week. Ideally, a second rapid test would be taken each week (depending on availability). PCR Tests should NOT be taken during this timeframe. Any positive rapid antigen test result during Day 20-90 will be treated as another positive case. In this event, we encourage you to consult your primary care physician.

Day 90 - At this point, you will return to the regular testing schedule for all students.

If you test positive for COVID

Due to the number of positive cases we are dealing with, we may or may not be able to get back to you with specific details about your isolation and return to campus.
